

3rd Press Release IntoDigits

An Innovative Toolkit for Trainers for the Development of the Digital & Numeracy Competence for Low Skilled Adults

Low skilled adults are among the groups most strongly affected by the recent financial crisis that has hit the European Union and many other countries. Adults specifically lacking low numeracy and digital skills are disproportionately characterised by poor health conditions, lower income, less active involvement in society and a substantial risk of social exclusion.

The European project IntoDigits aims to fill this gap. Funded by the Erasmus+ program, IntoDigits has designed a training course aimed at developing numeracy and digital skills, designed specifically for this target group.

At this stage, the project has developed two Qualification Frameworks on Numeracy and Digital competences and 42 digital tools for trainers, useful for the implementation of activities and workshops that will facilitate increasing the Active Citizenship of participants.

In addition, as part of the Online Toolkit, an Online Assessment has recently been created and developed in order to proceed with the testing of training tools to obtain feedback from trainers and users, with the aim of making corrections if there are gaps to be filled. This Online Assessment is now available in our official website (<http://intodigits.projectsgallery.eu/assessment/>) to be used during the first phase of the evaluation, offering two different assessment tools:

Numeracy Assessment and Digital Assessment, so the user can use them by making a quiz that will provide an assessment of their numeracy and digital skills.

In the upcoming stage, pilot workshops will be tested, once the level of the learners is known thanks to the previous online assessments. Furthermore, a total of six Multiplier Events will be held for the purpose to explain the Active Citizenship ladder concept and how an adult can be evaluated in terms of AC against this scale. Thus, partners will show to an audience of interested stakeholders the use of the Project Tool Kit, i.e. activities and workshops for the development of the individual's competences regarding Numeracy and Digital skills.

Note that the workshops will be tested and presented to the public following the recommendations of the Health authorities due to the COVID-19 public health crisis. Online options might be also available.
